From the Principal

In last week's Newsletter I indicated that we had a busy week ahead and that certainly proved to be the case. I am very happy to say in this week's report that everything ran smoothly and my thanks go to the students and staff for the excellent school spirit and cooperation that they demonstrated in such abundance during the week.



Clearing The Bar

The rain held off, attendance by students was pleasing, participation rates were high and a number of records were broken. The bar was certainly set high at our annual Athletics Carnival, both metaphorically and literally and the boys met the challenge in a most impressive way. The carnival was held at the Homebush facility for the second year in a row and I thank the P&C for their funding which allows us to use this wonderful venue. There were some excellent performances, but I would particularly like to mention the superb achievements of Sean Barnes (Year 12) who set individual records in the Triple Jump, Long Jump, Hurdles and was part of the Warrigal Open Boys team which broke the 1968 record in the 4 x 100 relay. Other records broken were by Zihao Liu in the 13yrs 90m hurdles, Trent Monaghan in the 15yrs 100m and Marcus Yeung in the 15 yrs 100m hurdles. With the many fine performances on the day, our prospects in the forthcoming zone championships certainly look very promising. Congratulations also, to Mr Rodgie and Mr Boyle for their excellent organisation, particularly with the problems created by the late arrival of our Year 7 and Year 9 students.

Improving our buildings

A significant area of our planning in the year ahead will be to improve the physical environment of the school so that we can provide the most effective environment for teaching, learning and working. With your support in general, and the P&C in particular, I intend to initiate a submission for a major capital works program to refurbish the entrance to the school, foyer and administration areas. This will involve a long, protracted process and quite frankly, one that in the current economic climate is going to be difficult to get through. However, I still think it would be worth having a go and if it is successful, will bring enormous long term benefits to the school. As a backup plan, I also intend to put a modified proposal forward to the P&C which will involve a refurbishment of just the foyer area.

There is another project that I would also like to initiate in the near future, and one that could be used to mark our 50th Anniversary. We are desperately in need of covered areas around the school for use in wet weather and as protection from the sun on hot days. I have approached the P&C for support to fund the provision of an all-weather cover at the rear of the school hall which would not only serve this purpose, but would also provide us with a wonderful area that can be utilised when we have various functions in the school hall. At this stage, no costing has been done, but I will pursue this and advise the P&C in the near future of what estimated costs for this project will be.

Annual Report and School Plan

The Annual Report will be dispatched for printing this week for distribution in June. I have been working with the staff on finalising the targets to be achieved by the end of the year and also the School Plan for 2008, the document which closely aligns with it, setting out the detail of how the targets will be achieved. The key targets for this year are:

- To enhance the quality of the school's teaching and learning programs
- To further implement technology in teaching programs
- To review the school's programs to support the welfare needs of students
- To foster increased collaboration between the school and its community

NAPLAN Launched

Our Year 7 and Year 9 students joined approximately 350,000 students throughout Australia in sitting for the

inaugural national tests in literacy and numeracy this week. I have no doubt that the results of these tests will come under considerable scrutiny both by the media and by the DET and I look forward to receiving the data on our boys' performance when it is published.

50th Anniversary Planning Well Under Way

The staff/parent committee organising the 50th Anniversary celebrations has had several meetings and is close to finalising the agenda for the weekend of August 30-31 which will be the focus of our celebrations. Could all members of the Normanhurst community please spread the word, particularly to past students and staff and let them know these dates. Our school website will provide updated information in the weeks ahead.

Further Improving Communication with our Community

In the very near future we will be implementing two initiatives that will further enhance the channels of communication between the school and its community. The first of these is the introduction of a system of SMS message alerts to notify parents when your son is either late or absent from school. The other initiative is the emailing of our school newsletter each week to replace the printed copies that are currently distributed. For those parents who still wish to receive a hard copy of the Newsletter, these will be available at the front office for collection. In order to facilitate the transition for both of these projects, I would ask all parents to complete the form contained in this Newsletter so that we can begin the process of entering the data.

Resolving Issues of Concern

It is our aim to work with all of our school community to ensure that we do the very best we can to ensure a productive, safe and enjoyable school experience for our students. However, there are bound to be occasions from time to time when you have a concern or issue that you wish to raise. In these situations, I extend a reminder to all that you are encouraged to contact the school and tell someone so that your concern can be resolved. In order to address the issue most effectively and quickly, it would be helpful if you could put your concerns in writing with your name and contact details. Letters written anonymously to the school often make it difficult for us to resolve issues because we are unable to clarify details for our investigation. You can be assured that any matter raised will be treated sensitively and confidentially.

Should you feel that you must raise a concern formally, the NSW Department of Education and Training has

procedures for ensuring that complaints are handled fairly. A brochure which provides information about how to lodge a complaint and a Complaint Form are available from the school office. Further information is also available in the Department's Complaints Handling Guidelines which includes a guide to Lodging a Complaint. P & C NEWS

Unfortunately our advertised speaker at Tuesday's P&C meeting, school counsellor, Mrs Joy Straw, was unable to attend because she was unwell, but the meeting heard a very informative report from principal, Mr Jeff Bruce, and approved a number of significant events. I'm sure Mr Bruce will include his information in the Principal's Report, so here I'll draw your attention only to those matters concerning the P&C.

New P&C Constitution and Bylaws: These have been discussed at the last couple of meetings and have been available on the school web page for the past month. Both were approved and we will proceed to register them through the NSW Federation of P&C Associations.

Financial approvals: At the 50th Anniversary Committee's request and with the school's endorsement, the meeting approved the cost of about \$900 for a DVD replicator. DVDs will be included in the souvenir pack given to those who attend the 50th Anniversary celebrations on the Saturday night, 30 August. The DVD copier will also be used by the school to create multiple copies of events such as major excursions.

The meeting also approved \$1200 funding for software which will enable the school to SMS parents if their son is unexpectedly absent from school. The same software will also enable the school newsletter to be sent to parents electronically. You will be asked to provide your email address to receive this service. It will be much more reliable than the bottom of the school bag!

50th Anniversary Celebrations: The subcommittee reported on plans so far and there is another meeting soon. A large number of 'old boys' are being contacted – particularly well known ones who could be speakers. If you know an 'old boy' please let them know we are celebrating on Saturday 30 and Sunday 31 August, with a wide range of entertainment and events which are to be finalised. The committee is also looking for a business which has a **large marquee** which could be used to cover the outside space at the back of the hall. Alternatively, sponsorship of this expensive item would be welcomed. Please contact Mr Gow in the library.

Dr Andrew Martin, Wednesday 18 June: Please diarise this date. Dr Martin is a well regarded psychologist and will talk to us about boys' learning and

development, particularly in a setting of excellence. This event will start at 7pm in the school hall. A separate flyer will be distributed soon.
